
"Learning beyond textbooks! - Exploring the Red Fort's rich heritage."



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Diwan-i-Aam

Diwan-i-Khas The Hall of Royal Grandeur-adorned with intricate carvings and once home to the famous Peacock Throne, it echoes the grandeur of a bygone era.



Rang Mahal

The Palace of Colors this vibrant palace in the Red Fort was adorned with ornate mirrors, floral paintings, and a flowing water stream, reflecting the splendor of Mughal architecture.



The Lahori Gate is the main entrance of the Red Fort in Delhi. Made of red sandstone, it leads to Chatta Chowk, a historic marketplace.
